

Turn up the volume this summer with our new exhibition exploring seven decades of New Zealand music and the homegrown talent behind it.

Volume: Making Music in Aotearoa is the first major exhibition of New Zealand music. *Volume* pays tribute to the musicians who have provided the soundtrack to our lives and gets you closer to making music yourself with these hands on experiences:

- Step into a recording studio and mix a song
- Spin the decks as a DJ
- Flip through records in a record store
- Play a classic Kiwi song on real instruments
- Have a dance on the set of 1960s' TV music show C'mon

Inside *Volume* you can get up close to hundreds of objects from the personal collections of some of Aotearoa's most well-known artists – with costumes, instruments, handwritten lyrics, awards, images, and memorabilia all helping to bring the story of New Zealand music to life.

The music doesn't need to stop when you leave *Volume* – by tagging your **Spark All Access Pass** as you explore the exhibition, you can take playlists, films and your own *Volume* moments home with you.
