## Tungaru: The Kiribati Project

'Tungaru: The Kiribati Project' is a collaboration between contemporary New Zealand artists, Chris Charteris and Jeff Smith. Tungaru is the pre-colonial name for Kiribati.

The project was born out of Chris' desire to return to Kiribati, to meet his family and to experience life on these tiny strips of atoll in the Pacific. Always with a camera in hand, Jeff was there to capture much of the journey. The exhibition is not only a personal story about family but one that also references the larger global issues of climate change, over-population and threats to traditional cultures.

The exhibition features a selection of artworks from Chris, an interactive Kiribati warrior created by Jeff, and archival footage of Kiribati, alongside pieces from the Museum's Kiribati collections.

## Entangled Islands: Sāmoa, New Zealand and the First World War

'Entangled Islands' is the first in a series of exhibitions about the New Zealand war experience over the coming years of the centenary. On 29 August 1914, only three weeks after war began, New Zealand troops took

over Sāmoa – then under German control. It was an event that would entangle New Zealand and Sāmoa through bad times, and better ones. New Zealand's military occupation and subsequent control of Sāmoa (until it regained independence in 1962) left a lasting impact on the cultures of both Pacific nations. 'Entangled Islands' opens the door on a little-known part of our shared history.

# First World War Centenary 1914 – 1918



At 3pm on 5 August 1914, the New Zealand Governor, Lord Liverpool, read a telegram from His Majesty King George V to a crowd of 15,000 people gathered at Parliament in Wellington. The telegram expressed The King's appreciation for the solidarity of his overseas dominions after Britain declared war with Germany. Lord Liverpool responded with New Zealand's own commitment to make any sacrifice necessary. With that commitment, New Zealand officially entered the First World War, forever changing our society.




# Dinosaur Footprints - A Story of Discovery


