2) The Story of the National Council of Women New Zealand

In 1896 NCWNZ was formed at a women's convention in Christchurch and **Kate Sheppard**, who had led the campaign for women's suffrage, was elected President, an office she held for three years. The International Council of Women (ICW) had been formed in USA in 1888 and it was from this that the New Zealand organisation took its name. Women's organisations were the members, not individual women.

From the start, NCWNZ was an advocate on behalf of women in the home and in the workplace, whether vulnerable, or strong and capable. They were concerned about the conditions for women industrial workers so they proposed an eight hour day and a minimum wage.



They passed resolutions in favour of prison reform and against capital punishment. They wanted to raise the age of consent to sexual intercourse from 16 to 18 or even 21 in order to protect young women from sexual diseases, which were rife.

One speaker urged equal grounds for divorce for men and women. A resolution passed at the first conference was "That in all cases where a woman elects to superintend her own household and to be the mother of children, there shall be a law attaching a just share of her husband's earnings or income for her separate use, payable if she so desire it, into her separate account."

Revival and Restructuring: 1918-1939

During World War I, an initiative to revive NCWNZ came from Kate Sheppard, **Christina Henderson** and **Jessie Mackay** in Christchurch. Representatives of women's organisations from Auckland, Christchurch, Dunedin, Gisborne and Wellington met in Wellington in April 1918. By this time, a quarter of all women were in the work force. The time was right to bring women's issues to the fore again. Kate was president for a year and was followed by **Ellen Melville** (1919-23), a lawyer with her own practice who was an Auckland City Councillor for 33 years.

There was a change of structure. The new NCW established branches around the country. There were eight by 1929 and 14 by 1940. In the 1920s and 1930s a large number of women's organisations were founded and many of them joined NCWNZ branches. This was the start of the nationwide network that is NCWNZ today. Conferences in the 1920s, held every second year from 1925, were brief and practical.

Increasingly, NCWNZ co-ordinated women's opinions and relayed them to the government. New Zealand delegates attended ICW conferences and 17 women attended the first Women's Pacific Rim Conference in Honolulu in 1928.



In 1926 the first 17 women Justices of the Peace included **Annie Fraer**, who became NCWNZ President from 1927-31.

An article in NCWNZ *Bulletin* in 1928 listed "What New Zealand Women Want": women on juries and the Prisons Board, women police, a woman co-censor of films, a woman member of New Zealand's delegation to the League of Nations.

Concerns included the high death rate of women in childbirth and by septic abortion, equal salaries and status for male and female teachers, improved conditions in schools, and equal pay and promotion in the Civil Service.

NCWNZ was very aware that New Zealand women were lagging behind the British, who were able to be jurors and members of parliament from 1919; there were 15 British women MPs by 1929. The first New Zealand woman MP was **Elizabeth McCombs** in 1933. NCWNZ lobbied throughout the 1920's for the right for women to sit on juries.

The focus gradually moved from equal rights issues to moral issues such as the compulsory notification of venereal disease, and issues resulting from the Depression. In 1931 the Auckland NCW Branch co-operated with its affiliate, the YWCA, to open a register of unemployed women, the first time they were ever recorded officially.

The Christchurch Branch President set up a scheme for teaching cookery to unemployed girls who produced hundreds of dinners for needy families and the elderly. Dunedin Branch was behind the establishment of a Women's Unemployment Committee which placed many women in domestic service.

An issue of particular concern was nationality after marriage. In all Commonwealth countries a woman who married a foreigner took on his nationality and lost her right to vote, pension rights and the right to diplomatic protection abroad. The 1935 Labour Government restored the right to vote, but could not make any other changes as the whole Commonwealth had not agreed to them.

World War II: 1939-45

During the war, NCW branches worked locally, with welcome clubs for servicemen, patriotic committees collecting clothing and funds to help victims of war, sewing, knitting and growing food. Dunedin Branch's suggestion of collecting food for Britain, became a national initiative which resulted in the sending of nearly 70 tons of food.

In 1944 NCWNZ conference had an important new feature, the attendance of presidents of seven nationally organised societies. This major change meant that from that time NCWNZ could tap into the expertise of those societies and respond to their particular concerns.

Post War: 1946-65

Soldiers returned home and women married young and settled down to child rearing. There was full employment and a shortage of labour so some married women joined the workforce, usually short term in semi-skilled jobs. NCWNZ presidents between the wars had mostly been single, professional women; now they were usually married, not in the workforce and many were involved in Christian churches.

A late NCW 50th anniversary celebration was held in Christchurch in 1950. It was opened by **Clara Alley**, who had been at the 1896 meeting. The president of the time, **Flora Forde**, was elected as a vice president of the ICW, the first New Zealand woman since Kate Sheppard to fill that role.



The post war years were quiet ones for NCWNZ, dominated by one over-riding concern - equal pay. A resolution on equal pay for equal work had been passed in 1897, and had been supported from that time forward. Strong support was provided for Public Service Association women through the 1940s and 1950s. In 1956 the spotlight fell on the case of Jean Parker, who appealed a young male cadet being promoted ahead of her. Her salary was reduced and she was relieved of responsibilities. NCWNZ was holding its conference in Auckland at the time, and took immediate action. The same day, 42 branches and affiliated nationally organised societies deluged the Prime Minister and MPs with telegrams condemning the Public Service Action. There was a debate in parliament and the

government intervened to reinstate Jean. **Dame Hilda Ross**, National Government Minister, in opening the conference, had said, "When such a large and united body of women keeps hammering hard enough and long enough, no government can afford **not** to listen!" This was certainly proved in the case of Jean Parker.

In 1957 *The Council for Equal Pay and Opportunity* was formed. NCWNZ joined in this new organisation with major unions and some of its most influential affiliated societies: the Federation of University Women, the Maori Women's Welfare League, the Association of Business and Professional Women and the Young Women's Christian Association. They lobbied hard and in 1960 the Government Service Equal Pay Bill became law. A significant in-house development for NCWNZ was the renting of rooms in Bowen House in 1961. The office was open three days a week from 10 am - 3 pm.

A petition was organised for jury service for women to be on the same terms as men. Women had been able to put their names forward for juries from 1942, but few had done so. In 1962 jury service was made equal for both sexes but women could still opt out on the grounds of their sex until 1976.

From 1963 the government contributed towards the cost of sending NCW representatives to ICW conferences.

The Modern NCW: 1966-

Mavis Tiller (1966-70) was the president who moved NCWNZ into the modern era. A woman of breadth of view and depth of experience, she had a broad outlook, humane vision and acute political awareness who also became an outstanding convener of the ICW Standing Committee on International Relations and Peace.

The role of the Parliamentary Watch Committee was clarified in 1968 and it has played a key role ever since. It was to continue to alert branches and nationally organised societies and the appropriate minister when a clause in a bill needed attention. NCWNZ's most effective political action became the submissions made on most bills and many discussion papers.



If NCWNZ, as a national organisation, was to have credibility in its submissions, it had to be able to demonstrate that they were based on agreed policy. This meant that the resolutions passed at conferences, which embodied the policy, assumed a new importance.

Ad hoc committees were set up to support New Zealand representatives on ICW committees and they developed into NCWNZ's own standing committees. The Executive was expanded into a Board of Management with eight members.

Women were encouraged to seek membership of boards and organisations. Mavis became the first woman to serve on a Royal Commission in 30 years - the Commission on Social Security. Her vice president Miriam Dell was the only woman on the National Development Council from 1969-74 and convened a sub-committee which evolved into the Committee on Women which she chaired from 1974-81. This was a forerunner of the Ministry of Women's Affairs. In 1971 she became the only woman on the Equal Pay Commission. Both Mavis and Miriam were later on conservation bodies. Laurie Salas represented NCWNZ on the National Consultative Committee on Disarmament and Vivienne Boyd chaired the Consumer Council for six years and was the only woman on the Royal Commission on Nuclear Power Generation. Grace Hollander was vice president of the Standards Council. The list goes on and on.

Miriam Dell, president from 1970 to 1974, continued the reshaping of the council and fully maintained the momentum built up by Mavis Tiller. Equal pay was a dominant issue in this period (the last push before legislation in 1972) and conservation was growing in importance. She was the New Zealand co-ordinator of the United Nations International Women's Year and a delegate to the three UN women's conferences held during the 1975-85 Decade for Women - in Mexico, Copenhagen and Nairobi.



In 1974, NCWNZ was able to buy a house in Wellington and at last there was a permanent headquarters. Later, it was sold and a house at 10 Park Street, Thorndon was purchased.

At the end of the 1970's, Miriam Dell was elected president of the International Council of Women, the only New Zealander who has held this office. She served for more than seven years, from 1979 to 1986, an energetic and approachable president, who managed to pay official visits to 64 countries and was both firm and diplomatic in putting women's questions to national leaders. She organised the centenary celebrations of ICW, held in 1988 in Washington.

Through the 1980s and 1990s, NCWNZ has continued to work for women, with a vast volunteer force contributing throughout New Zealand. The strength of the organisation has always been in its grassroots membership. Fundraising became a major issue, with the aim of having a sound financial base, and a large amount of capital was raised. It was a wonderful recognition of the value of the Council's work, when in 1996, NCWNZ's centennial year, the Hon Jenny Shipley, then Minister of Women's Affairs, announced that the government would add \$300,000 to that fund.

Where Next?

As the 21st century began, NCWNZ members identified three major issues: accessibility and affordability of education, mental health, and women in employment, particularly with respect to part time and casual work. Special emphasis will also be placed on the rights and welfare of children, women and justice, and the care of the elderly including their carers. Today's members are as enthusiastic as the women who founded NCWNZ in 1896. They will continue to serve women, the family and the community through study, discussion and action at local, national and international level.

The Auckland Branch

The National Council of Women, Auckland Branch was formed in 1917. Initially, six groups took the opportunity to meet at the Civic League Rooms to discuss common interests. A second meeting was held on 13 June 1917. A further three womens' organisations joined the group and at this meeting the Auckland branch was formed with Ellen Melville as convenor.

NCWNZ membership was open to all Women's organisations. Founding organisations were the Civic League, Y.W.C.A., W.C.T.U., Women's National Reserve, The Society for the Protection of Women and Children and the Women's Political League, The Women Teachers Assoc., Women's Mutual Aid and the Girls' Friendly Society.

As an umbrella organisation the NCWNZ has provided a powerful political network and lobby group that acted at local national and international levels.

3. Processing notes

The original arrangement of each collection has been maintained. To facilitate easy access to like items, the original inventories have been adapted by introducing a **Branch title** including Auckland Branch, National Office, Associate Group. These headings indicate the origin of the records.

A subheading **Type of records** has been introduced with the aim of bring all like material together. This provides an intellectual series heading that is not available in the original inventories. For example the *Minutes and meeting papers* gathers all papers including agendas, minutes and reports together and allows a view over the different filing systems within each collection. With the exception of *Subjects Addressed* all **Type of record** titles are artificial and have been created during the development of the combined inventory. The term *Subjects Addressed* has been carried over from the original inventory.

The **Description** field contains date range as well an indication of the content.

Ref. No. is the collection call number.

Item No. is the original number given to that particular item or folder within a collection.

In the process of developing the combined inventory, all files within the collections have been sighted and where necessary have been re-housed into acid free folders. However the contents have not been examined or described in any close detail.

The **History of the NCW** taken from the website included in this document highlights the social issues the Council focused over the years and should be used as an additional guide / pointer to other information that may be found in the collections.
