FELT AND BUTTON POPPY

Make your own Anzac Day Poppy.




You will need: red and green felt, green pipecleaner, black button, scissors, safety pin.



First of all create a template for the petals on paper. We used a tablespoon measure. Don't create a complete circle - draw a little lip.



Cut out four petals from the felt using the template.



Now create a paper template for your leaves. Again give it a little lip at the end. And cut out two leaves from the green falt



For the two leaves and the four petals, poke a hole through the lip using a safety pin. You may need a grown up to help you with this part.



You may need to use a skewer or something similar to slightly widen each hole.



Now thread the two leaves then the four petals onto a green pipecleaner.



Put the button on top – thread the pipecleaner through one hole and back through another. Then twist the pipecleaner under the button to secure. Pull tight.



If you want the poppy to be a brooch, you can glue on a safety pin, using hot glue. Be careful with this bit.




CREPE PAPER POPPY

Make your own Anzac Day Poppy.



Gather your supplies – red crepe or tissue paper, green pipecleaner, scissors, safety pin and a little circle of black paper (we coloured some white paper black). Alternatively you could also colour in some white paper with a red felt tip. Or create the poppy with white paper and decorate it red at the end!



Fold your crepe or tissue paper many times, then cut out a multi-layered circle. We just did this rough, but you can create a template if you like.



Lay your small black circle on top of your red layers and push a safety pin through. Perhaps get a grown up to help you with this bit. Wiggle the pin to make sure the hole is wide enough for your pipe cleaner



Push the pipe cleaner through all the layers.



Twist a little spiral on the front and the back so that the poppy stays secure.



And there's your paper poppy. You can also add a safety pin to this one if you like with a piece of tape or push it through a buttonhole.
